piano and window(s)

amid thoughts of Arnold Schoenberg

A performance in a home occurs with a piano and one to four windows to the outside.

One or more people open and close one to four windows. Each window is opened and closed *x* number of times, where *x* equals the number of windows used in a performance. One observes long rests before and after opening or closing a window.

One person plays a piano following a score comprised of four systems of music. Each system contains two twelve note phrases: one ascending, in black, and one descending, in blue. One plays from x number of systems with each of the two phrases in a system played x number of times, where in both instances x equals the number of windows used in a performance. While any one phrase is played, additional phrases in the same system are not played—ascending, descending and/or any requisite repetitions—whereas phrases from other systems used in the performance may be played. Rests occur between phrases in the same system. Phrases are played at different speeds but always very slowly and very softly. The piano's pedals may be used.

All actions are performed simply and attentively for oneself and anyone nearby.
